






ASYLUM SEEKERS | TIME LINE OF SERVICE PROVISION

Criteria to consider around sponsorship

- 1) Approval of leadership of congregation to explore asylum-seeker sponsorship
- Capacity to create a team of people committed to work together for a year or more to walk with the asylees sponsored- team size should be no less than 5-6 people and needs to include several people who can communicate in the asylee's language
- Capacity to raise funds to cover costs for food, clothing, shelter, housing, medical care, legal fees, immigration
 case expenses, transportation and incidentals
- Cross-cultural training and racial justice work has happened or is happening not only for the team but the congregation.
- 5) Capacity to connect the asylee's with legal services, either pro bono or paid.
