Food Pantry Update

Loaves and Fish Pantry

Food Insecurity on Cape Cod, and throughout the United States, is well documented, and pantries everywhere are seeing the needs increase monthly. This is true for our Loaves and Fishes Pantry with double the number of visits in November compared to last year at this time. The 148 client visits in November helped feed 499 of our neighbors and probably more if any families shared their Turkey dinners with extended family or friends. Your generosity got us through these past few months with the cuts in the amount of food we were able to get from the Greater Boston Food Bank. Our families appreciate every can of kidney beans or box of pasta that is left in our donation barrel, or an extra check that is donated to the pantry. What is amazing is that this is only one of many outreach programs that our church was involved in over these past weeks including the Seafarers bags, and diapers for the Baby Center, to the many gift bags filled by the funds raised at the Cranberry Fair. We have now passed out almost 100 new coats, and you helped provided bags of gifts and gift cards for 90 children whose families use our pantry. St. Peter's takes to heart the second commandment to "Love your neighbor as yourself." We know that we can count on our congregation and friends to meet whatever needs 2024 brings.

Our pantry team is down a few valuable members. Karen Beggs is taking some time off after years of faithfully filling carts and carts of groceries, and we know she will be missed. Carol Vrlik is making good progress rehabbing and plans to return as soon as possible. Luckily we have added Carol Schachinger and Kim Anstey to our crew, and we are thrilled to have them. If you're interested in volunteering, please let me know.

Your brown grocery bags, coupons, and egg cartons, especially the cardboard ones, have been a big help. Although we include a wish list of our current needs, all non-perishable items are always helpful and welcome. Happy New Year!




St. Peter's Prayer Shawl Ministry will meet on Friday, January 5 and Friday, January 19 at 1:30 pm.

Rotations and Revolutions

One day on a planet is the time it takes to complete a 360 degree rotation beginning at midnight. Mars does it in 24.6 hours and the Earth in 23.9 hours. One year is the time it takes a planet to complete a revolution around the sun. We can sense a daily rotation, but not annual revolutions as the Earth's velocity exceeds 60 thousand mph! It varies between 65,000 and 68,000 mph depending on the Earth's distance from the sun. Its maximum velocity occurs on January 4 when the Earth is farthest from the sun. The Earth travels over 500 million miles around an erratic elliptical orbit per year! Remember: the sun doesn't rise; it's the Earth that sets, and the sun doesn't set; it's the Earth that rises! Planets rotate and revolve from west to east depending upon locations from which they are viewed.

As the orbital velocity of the Earth slows down, Earth residents gain a bonus of living time between June and August. Residents of Cape Cod have an extra long summer while the residents of Australia experience an extra long winter although their winters are warmer than ours. This means the northern hemisphere gets more sunlight than the southern hemisphere. We add an extra day to eight of our months to adjust our calendar for this extra living.

The Earth rotates every 23.9 hours, not a convenient 24 hours, so a leap day is added in February every four years to compensate for the loss of 24 hours, and leap seconds can be added as often as needed to keep our calendar exact. At some point in time, the Earth's rotation will slow to exactly 24.0 hours meaning leap periods will not be required.

Have you heard about the "precession of the equinoxes"? As rotation slows down, there's a tiny wobble like a spinning top does when it slows down. It takes about 26,000 years for the Earth to make just one 360 degree wobble meaning 13,000 years from now, our winter would begin in June and summer in December. Scientist will, no doubt,

adjust our calendar to the way it's meant to be.

The most incredible revolution is the solar system's velocity of 25 miles per second as it traverses clockwise around the Milky Way galaxy. It takes about two billion years for one 'cosmic' orbit to occur around this massive galaxy, 200,000 light years in diameter! One light year is slightly less that six trillion miles.



Pastor Dennis' Commentary: As the ancients before us, the earth and sea speak to the beauty and power of the created world. Gazing into the cosmos brings awe and wonder. The words of the Psalmist (92:5, 40:5, 104:24 and others) demonstrate humanity's feeble attempts to place into words that which the eye observes.
